THE CIRCLE DRIVE AT THE FRONT OF THE SCHOOL IS DESIGNATED FOR <u>BUSSES ONLY</u> BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL.

ALL STUDENTS SHOULD BE DROPPED OFF IN THE BACK OF THE SCHOOL AT THE DOORS NEAR THE TENNIS COURTS.

STUDENTS SHOULD BE PICKED UP AT THE END OF THE DAY IN THE SAME PARKING LOT AS THE MORNING DROP OFF.

Attention 8th grade Parents:

Please be advised that <u>any</u> high school application forms for the IAM or other high schools outside of Chippewa Valley Schools require a minimum of 48 hours to process. The forms are confidential and will not be returned to students or parents; rather, they will be forwarded directly to the high school in question. NWEA/M-Step scores can be found in Parent Portal along with your student's most recent report card. Middle Schools in Chippewa Valley School District do not have the capability to print transcripts. That can only be done at the high school level. If needed, your student's current GPA can also be found in Parent Portal. All additional requests must be submitted in writing to your student's counselor, Ms. Gargalino at ngargalino@cvs.k12.mi.us.

IMPORTANT PROCEDURES

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(Please Read and Save)

<u>ABSENCE REPORTING PROCEDURE</u> - <u>ALL</u> absences, including hospital stays and vacations, should be reported to the main office by calling the attendance line. The office will then notify the teachers. **ABSENCES** should be called in before 8:00AM to (586)723-3799. Please leave the student's name, grade level, reason for absence and length of absence on the absence line. We are required to report illnesses to the Macomb County Health Department and must be advised of any illness, especially if contagious. It is also important to call the attendance line when your child is going to be tardy.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION FORM - Please make sure your child's emergency information is up-to-date throughout the year with current emergency phone numbers and authorized persons for picking up your child in case of illness. If a child becomes ill during the day, we expect that child will have a way to get home.

HOMEWORK REQUEST - If your student is absent, please have them check Schoology for homework assignments. If your student has a question regarding an assignment when they are absent, they can contact their teacher through Schoology, e-mail or by phone. For students going on vacation, make-up work should be requested the day they return from vacation. Make-up work should be completed within the same number of school days as he/she was absent, unless special arrangements have been made with each teacher.

EARLY DISMISSAL PROCEDURE - When a child needs to leave school early, please come to the office to sign the child out. Students will **only** be released to persons on their emergency form with a valid picture ID.

<u>STUDENT MESSAGES AND DELIVERIES</u> - If your child has called home because they have forgotten their lunch, money or any other item needed for the day, please bring it to the main office. Students are aware it is <u>their</u> responsibility to check for the item in the office. Lunches that are not picked up in the office are put on the stage in the cafeteria to be picked up during lunch time. When a delivery is unexpected, your child will be notified at a time when it will least disrupt the class.

PLEASE TRY TO MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO HELP YOUR CHILD REMEMBER THEIR THINGS FOR THE SCHOOL DAY. IT IS DISRUPTIVE TO YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING DAY IF WE HAVE TO CALL THEM TO THE OFFICE TO PICK UP THINGS OR TO MAKE A PHONE CALL TO YOU. When delivering lunches, notebooks, money, etc., <u>PLEASE</u> make sure your child's name is clearly marked on the item.

MOVING??



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If you have moved, please provide the Iroquois office with proof of your new residency. Items that are accepted are a copy of a signed lease, a copy of the closing papers from a purchase or 2 current utility bills. Once all documentation has been received, we can then change your child's address on file. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.

PLEASE DO NOT BRING THESE ITEMS TO SCHOOL ...

- ⇒ Perfume or cologne: There are a couple of students that are HIGHLY allergic to these items. Please refrain from using them at school.
- ⇒ Balloons or flowers: Please do not deliver these items to students. There is simply no place for the student to keep them during the day. Also, balloons are not allowed on the busses.

LOCKER DECORATION

Students may decorate lockers for birthdays only before school begins between 7:15-7:30AM. Please remember to bring your own supplies and tape.

IS YOUR STUDENT'S LOCKER GETTING JAMMED?

Please make sure that there is no contact paper or tape on the inside of the locker door. Also, any mirrors or magnets stuck to the inside of the door need to be away from the edge of the door. The mechanism that opens the locker door runs the entire length of the door. If anything is blocking it, that will cause the locker not to open.

Medication Administration in School

Listed below are some key points in the Chippewa Valley School District Medication Administration Policy. The purpose of the policy is to support the health needs of children during school hours and to ensure the safety of all children.

- Legislation on Inhalers: Public Act 10 allows a public or non-public school student to possess and use a metered dose inhaler of a dry powder inhaler for the relief of asthma symptoms, or before exercise to prevent the onset of asthma symptoms while at school, or on school-sponsored transportation, or at any schoolsponsored activity if there is written approval from the student's physician or other health care provider and the student's parent/guardian for the student to possess and use the inhaler; and the building administrator has received a copy of the written approvals from the physician and the parent/guardian.
- * Any student that requires an EpiPen, is diabetic or takes seizure medication, MUST have an action plan completed and on file with our Health Aide. Action Plan forms are available at the school.
- * Before any medication can be administered in school, written authorization from the child's physician and parent must be obtained and be on file in the school office. Separate forms are available in the main office and on the district's website for prescription and non-prescription medications.
- * All medication should be brought to school by the child's parent/guardian.
- * All medication should be in the original bottle or container. Medication not in the original bottle cannot be administered.
- * Containers should be labeled with the child's name, medication, dose, time and route of administration.
- * Information on the use and adverse effects of any medication given in school should be provided to the school by the parent, pharmacist, or physician.
- * Parents must notify school personnel if their child has conditions such as allergies, diabetes, or asthma, so that proper precautions/training may be put in place.

WINTER BUS RULES

Basic bus rules apply all year long; but, now that winter is here, we would like to review some rules that might especially pertain to this time of year.

- 1. Students should be standing at the bus stop at least 10 minutes before the bus normally arrives. After the driver turns off the flashing red lights, they may not pick up any more students at that stop. Drivers may not wait for tardy students!
- 2. Due to slippery roads, stay on the sidewalk while waiting for the bus to arrive. If no sidewalk is present, please stay as far back from the roadway as possible.
- 3. Because of possible limited visibility it is extremely important to remember to cross in front of the bus only after a signal from the driver.
- 4. Due to road conditions in the winter, it is very important that you wait until the bus has come to a complete stop and the door is open before approaching the bus.
- 5. Students must remain seated at all times. Students should leave their seat only after the bus comes to a complete stop.
- 6. All students should dress appropriately for the weather. Boots, mittens, hats, scarves, coats, etc., should be put on before leaving the bus. If they do forget a piece of clothing, ask the driver for it the next morning. The drivers keep such articles of clothing on the bus until claimed.
- 7. Please be patient when waiting for the bus. Inclement weather including rain, snow and sleet will cause traffic delays and the buses to run behind schedule. The buses may arrive late but they will be there. Please watch or listen to the following radio and television stations for any school closing information:

APPROPRIATE SCHOOL FASHION

- Shorts, skirts/skorts must be below middle fingertip length when a student's arm is extended at their side.
- **NO** leggings can be worn alone. You must wear a longer shirt over them.
- **NO** short shirts showing undergarments or exposing the waistline while in the standing or sitting position.
- Pants **MUST** be worn at the waistline.
- NO bandanas are allowed in school even if the girls wear them to hold their hair back (they should use regular headbands - not bandanas folded up).
- All sleeves **MUST** cover the shoulders with a full hand's width.
- NO hats can be worn in school.
- NO tank tops are allowed, but may be worn ONLY IF it is being covered at all times by an appropriate shirt.
- Shoes must be worn at all times.
- Ripped clothing, such as jeans, should not expose under-garments and rips must be below middle finger tip length.
- NO clothing made of see-through material.
- NO muscle shirts.
- NO clothing advertising tobacco, alcohol, or drugs may be worn in school.
- NO clothing containing designs/pictures/symbols or language that are sexually suggestive, vulgar or profane are allowed in school.
